NSEE Principles of Ethical & Best Practice for Experiential Educators, *Pam Brumbaugh, Elon University, Elon, North Carolina*

Workshop participants will examine two NSEE foundation documents, the *Guiding Principles of Ethical Practice* and *Principles of Best Practice in Experiential Education*. The goal is to develop a deep understanding of these principles through both a theoretical examination of the contents and a hands-on experiential component where participants will be given an opportunity to generate ideas specific to their own programs. **(Track 1)**

Assessment 101: Identifying, Understanding and Applying Outcomes Assessment in Experiential Education, *James Walters, Montgomery College, Takoma Park, Maryland*

This workshop will introduce beginners to the fundamentals of assessment in experiential learning settings and provide intermediate level assessment training for practitioners beyond the beginner's level, who seek to improve their outcomes assessment skills. The primary goal is to assist participants in the development of an outcomes assessment plan to use at their own institution. Employing a hands-on, active learning approach, this workshop will include a mix of presentation, applied tasks, small group work, and interactive discussion. **(Track 2)**

SPEAKER Bios

Pam Brumbaugh is entering her 25th year as Director of Experiential Education and Assistant Professor at the Elon University Career Center, where she has worked to help develop and refine Elon's Experiential Learning Requirement (ELR), with a focus on internships and co-ops. Much of the information and insight utilized in building the ELR program resulted from Elon's long-time NSEE membership. Pam currently serves on the NSEE Board as Vice President.

Jim Walters is a tenured professor at Montgomery College, Maryland, and holds degrees in English and Theatre. His work in theatre as actor, choreographer and director led him to an exploration of experiential learning as those art forms embody the principles of experiential education in development, assessment and evaluation of the work. Jim is currently Director of Student Life at MC/Takoma Park/Silver Spring, where he is responsible for a variety of learning opportunities, leadership development and service-learning programs. Jim currently is working in collaboration with Montgomery County Public Schools on a cascading model of service-learning for middle school through college age students, with a focus on making good academic and personal choices. He is additionally working on a three year national grant funded by the National Campaign to End Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy in collaboration with the American Association of Community Colleges, using experiential learning frameworks to inform model curricula to respond to this issue with college students in varied venues. Jim serves on the NSEE Board of Directors as President.
